Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Gutillo, that the Angola Record be designated as the official Village paper for the ensuing year; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Walters, that the Evans National Bank of Angola be designated as the official depository of Village funds; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Walters, that John H. Dye be appointed Village Clerk and Tax Collector for the ensuing year; Carried.

The Mayor, pursuant to Section 111 of the Village Law appointed Mr. William Stevenson, Jr., John H. Dye and C. H. Stocker as a budget committee, to prepare and submit a budget for the ensuing year.

Moved by Mr. Gutillo and seconded by Mr. Walters, that John Walters be appointed Village Policeman for the ensuing year; Carried.

Organization Meeting Continued.

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Moved by Mr. Stevenson and seconded by Mr. Walters that a contract be let to Anthony Pfohl to collect the village refuse, rubbish and garbage once a week on a day to be determined by the Board, at a yearly rate of \$520.00, in accordance with the terms of a contract to be prepared by the Village Attorney; Carried.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Erick.

Minutes of Annual Meeting read and approved.

Motion by Mr. Walters and seconded by Mr. Stocker that Assessors (3) for the current year, be appointed by the Mayor; Carried. The Mayor appointed Joseph Gutillo, Wm. Stevenson, Jr., and C. H. Stocker.

Moved by Mr. Walters and seconded by Mr. Stevenson that Ralph Walters be re-appointed as Fire Commissioner for a term of three (3) years; Carried.

A number of applications were received for the position of Water Superintendent. Same were duly considered and on motion duly made and seconded a vote was taken which resulted as follows: Total number of votes cast 4 of which Samuel Holland received 4. Mr. Holland's bid was \$1650.00, for one (1) years service; he to furnish own car, gas, license, insurance, etc., and to assume the office Friday, April 7, 1933.

Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Walters that the Clerk notify Frank Gugino that his services as Pumper would not be required after Saturday, April 15, 1933; Carried.

A contract for the collection of garbage was awarded to Anthony Pfohl, at his bid of \$520.00, for one (1) year.

Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Stevenson that a building permit be issued to Frank Sibley to erect a one (1) story cement block building 20 X 45 feet in size, on his lot on the Alley between High and Main Streets. Building to be used as a milk dairy. Estimated value stated as \$800.00; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Stevenson that the hours of labor of the pumpers at the Waterworks pumping station be changed from two shifts of 12 hours each to three shifts of eight hours each and that an additional man be employed. The salary of each pumper to be \$75.00 per month; Carried.

Meeting of April 6, continued.

Moved by Mr. Stevenson and seconded by Mr. Walters that Max Ferris and Ray Reiser be employed as pumpers, in addition to Leo Widner whose services as pumper are to be continued; Carried.

Moved, seconded and carried the Board adjourn.

Meeting called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor Erick.

Minutes of las meeting read and approved.

Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Guttillo that we purchase one (1) Marietta Safe Cabinet, (1 hr. test, 52 in. high, 20 in. wide and 19 in. deep, inside measurements; same to be fitted with adjustable shelves and at least 2 document files, for the sum of \$90.00 delivered on ground floor of Hall; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stevenson and seconded by Mr. Guttillo that Village accept back taxes without penalties or interest added, up to and including June 1, 1933, and that notice be published in the official paper. After some discussion recorded vote was demanded which resulted as follows: Total no. votes 5; Mayor Erick, Trustees Stocker and Walters voted "No" Trustees Stevenson and Guttillo voted "Yes" Motion lost.

Regular Meeting of May 1st continued.

Moved by Mr. Walters and seconded by Mr. Gutillo that Mrs Lale House be appointed as Trustee of the Angola Free Library for the term of 5 years in place of Mrs. Inez Bosworth whose term of office had expired. Term of Mrs. House's office, Apr. 1, 1933 to Apr. 1, 1938; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stevenson and seconded by Mr. Stocker that Nickel Plate RR. be granted the regular residence rate for water service until further notice. This action being made necessary owing to lapse of contract permitted by former Board of Trustees; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Walters and seconded by Mr. Stocker that beginning Friday, May 19, and thereafter, garbage be collected on Fridays of each week instead of Saturdays as heretofore, and that notice be inserted in the official paper to that effect; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Walters and seconded by Mr. Stocker that the petition relative to tiling ditch adjacent to the T. C. Hess property, which petition was signed by a number of taxpayers, be tabled pending an investigation of the same by Mayor Erick; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Walters that Mayor Erick and Trustee Stevenson act as a special Finance Committee to negotiate a temporary loan from the Evans National Bank of Angola, in such amount as necessary to discharge 1932 unpaid bills and to meet principal and interest payments on bonds due and payable prior to receipt of 1933 taxes; said amount to be determined by Village Clerk who is hereby directed to prepare a list of outstanding bills and bonds as aforesaid; Carried.

Mr. Fred Landahl, Commander of Newcomb-Long Post American Legion, of Angola, extended an invitation to the Village officials to participate with the Post in the observance of Memorial Day, and on motion by Mr. Stocker seconded by Mr. Walters the invitation was accepted.

There having been no objection made by any taxpayer to the Village Budget for 1933, a hearing for which purpose having been held in pursuance to notice duly published and posted (date of hearing Apr. 29th, 1933), the budget was adopted. Motion to adopt being made by Mr. Stocker and seconded by Mr. Gutillo and duly carried.

WATER ORDINANCE

An Ordinance relating to Water and Water Rents of the Village of Angola, N. Y.:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as "Water Ordinance."

Section 2. BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS. The Village Board of the Village of Angola, N. Y., and their successors in office, are hereby constituted the Board of Water Commissioners of such Village. Such Board shall have jurisdiction over the waterworks and water supply of such Village pursuant to Article 9 of the Village Law of the State of New York.

Section 3. WATER RENTS. A scale of rents for the use of water may be established by the Board of Water Commissioners from time to time, and a copy thereof shall be posted in the office of the Commissioners in the Village Hall of the Village of Angola, and shall be subject to inspection by any person during usual business hours.

Section 4. PAYMENT OF WATER RENTS. Water rents shall be due and payable quarterly. Bills for the same shall be mailed by the Board, addressed to the property receiving the water unless a written request shall have been filed with the Board requesting that bills be mailed to some other address, in which event such bills shall be mailed to the address designated in the request. Water rents shall be paid at the Evans National Bank in the Village of Angola within fifteen (15) days after mailing such bills, without penalty. After the expiration of fifteen days from the date of mailing, a penalty of ten per centum (10%) of the amount of the bill (excluding arrearages) shall be added thereto and paid at the time of payment of the bill. If any such bill remains unpaid for thirty (30) days after the date of mailing, the water supply may be shut off until the full amount thereof, with penalties and arrearages, has been paid, together with such fees as may be fixed by the Board for the restoration of service.

Any such water rents shall be a lien on the real property upon which the water is used, and the Board of Water Commissioners may bring an action for the foreclosure thereof, or such Board may certify to the Village Clerk the amount of any such lien, which has not been paid at the time and in the manner prescribed by such Board, with a description of the real property affected thereby, and the Board of Trustees may include such amount in the annual tax levy and shall levy the same upon the real property in default.

Section 5. WHEN TO TAKE EFFECT. This ordinance shall take effect July 1st, 1933.

Board will insist that arrangements be made by all delinquents to take care of such back bills at the earliest possible time. Every courtesy will be shown to consumers in arrears and partial payments will be accepted. It is manifestly unfair to consumers who pay their bills promptly to allow others to continue on indefinitely in arrears. It should also be understood that water bills are a lien against real property and that such bills may be added to the tax roll in the same manner as other village taxes.

The Board sincerely hopes that it will not be necessary to deprive anyone of water service, but it does insist that each and every bill rendered for the 2d Quarter be paid. And it also wishes to impress upon all delinquent consumers that arrangements be made by them to settle such bills at the earliest possible moment. And finally, bear in mind that water bills as rendered for the 2d Quarter will be for water consumed during that quarter only; will not include arrearages, which will be billed separately; that there will be a penalty of 10% added to all 2d Quarter bills not paid on or before July 15th, and that in each case where such bills are not paid within thirty (30) days from date of issue, that water service will be discontinued.

The Board is ready to co-operate with all consumers and asks the co-operation of consumers in return.

This article has been prepared and is here published by the Board of Trustees (Water Commissioners) of the Village of Angola for the information of all water consumers.

## Angola Waterworks

### NEW WATER REGULATIONS Effective July 1, 1933

The new ordinance regulating the payment of water bills, in the Village of Angola, as recently adopted by the Board of Trustees, become effective July 1st.

That consumers may thoroughly understand the reason for the adoption of the new rules, it is only necessary to say that it has been brought about because of the excessive amount of arrearages of water bills. Because of this condition it has become absolutely necessary that steps be taken to enforce payment of all accounts.

The Board has taken into consideration the stringency of the times and realizes that it would create untold hardship were it to discontinue water service for non-payment of arrearages in full. Therefore, after a careful study of the matter, the decision was reached that beginning with the issuance of the 2d Quarter bills, on July 1st, that all consumers of that date would be billed for water consumed during that quarter only, and that such bills become due and payable on or before July 15th; that all such bills not paid on or before that date be subject to a penalty of 10%, and that water service be discontinued in the case of every consumer failing to pay his water bill by Aug. 1st, (thirty days after date of issue). Bear in mind that the 2d Quarter bills will be rendered for the amount of water consumed during that period only. In all cases where there are arrearages, separate bills will be rendered and the





In accordance with your request, we are pleased to submit the following proposal for furnishing professional engineering service for your water supply, sewers, and sewer disposal projects:

FIRST, we will make a complete survey of the requirements for remodeling your water treatment plant, including intake. This survey will include securing all the necessary data to properly lay out in detail, plans for this project.

SECOND, we will obtain all necessary data in order to make any necessary changes in the sewer layout, which was prepared in our office some time ago. This will also include a study and the obtaining of additional data for the location of the sewer lines.

a study and the obtaining of additional data for the location of the sewage disposal works.

THIRD, after completion of the above outline work, we will prepare detail plans of all structures. These plans to show all piping and necessary equipment within the structures.

FOURTH, specifications, both general and detail will be written for the entire project, including materials and equipment to be purchased.

FIFTH, proposals and contracts for competitive bidding will be drawn for the general contracts and for the purchase of materials, including pipe and pumps.

SIXTH, we will prepare reports and maps for the State Water Power & Control Commission and the State Department of Health, and submit these maps to these departments for their approval.

SEVENTH, we will assist in advertising and award of contracts, as follows:

- (a) We will furnish forms of Notice to Bidders on all contracts.
- (b) We will furnish you with a complete set of plans to be on display at your office for the information of bidders.
- (c) We will place on display a complete set of plans, in our office, and will give all necessary information to bidders.
- (d) When bids are received we will attend the meeting and tabulate the same.
- (e) We will advise you as to the materials offered, whether they conform to specifications and whether they are to the best interests of your village.

EIGHTH, we will give all necessary supervision to guide and instruct your field engineer or superintendent and will consult with board as you may desire. This service will be rendered by either Mr. Lozier or Mr. Elmendorf. Visits will be made once a week during construction.

NINTH, monthly estimates for the payment of general contracts and material contracts will be rendered the first of each month, and final estimates upon completion of the contracts.

TENTH, we will make a careful final inspection of the completed work. This inspection is to include workmanship, materials

and operation of equipment installed.

ELEVENTH, for a year after completion of the projects we will make periodic visits to inspect your systems, and will confer with your board regarding their operation.

If the entire project, including sewers, sewage disposal and remodeling of your water treatment plant is voted through, our charge for professional service will be:

For plans and specifications 3.25% of the actual cost of construction. This amount is to be payable within 30 days after the submission of plans and specifications to the village.

For necessary supervision, in accordance with Art. 8, our charge will be 1.5% of the actual cost of construction, to be payable in installments upon submission of monthly estimates.

Should the construction of these projects be spread over a period of five years, then our charges for plans and specifications will be 3.25% of the actual cost of construction, to be payable within 30 days after submission of plans and specifications to the village. For necessary supervision, in accordance with Art. 8, our charge will be 2.25% of the actual cost of construction, to be payable in installments upon submission of monthly estimates.

Should only the water project be voted through, our charge for plans and specifications will be 5% of the actual cost of construction. This amount to be payable within 30 days after submission of plans and specifications to the village. For necessary supervision, in accordance with Art. 8, our charge will be 1% of the actual cost of construction, to be payable in installments upon submission of monthly estimates.

The above charge does not include the furnishing of a field engineer or field inspector. Should you so desire, we will furnish you with a field engineer, you to pay his monthly salary direct to him, and he to be your representative in properly staking out the work and carrying it on to completion.

Should the projects not be voted through, our charge to you for the preliminary work to date of voting will be a sum not to exceed \$500.00.

PROPOSITION No. 2. Sewer Project.

Shall a system of sewers and a sewage disposal plant be erected and installed in the Village of Angola, in accordance with plans thereof now on file in the office of the Village Clerk, such project to be completed in installments over a period of four (4) years, as shown upon said plans, at a total expense not exceeding \$195,000.00; \$47,400.00 thereof to be appropriated by the federal emergency administration of public works from relief funds designated for such purpose and the balance of \$147,600.00 to be raised by the Village of Angola by the issuance of bonds of said village for an amount not exceeding \$ 147,600.00 to the federal emergency administrator of public works, or such other federal agency as may be authorized so to act, pursuant to Chapter 782 of the Laws of 1933 of the State of New York; such bonds to be refunded by the raising annually by tax upon the taxable property in the Village of a sum sufficient to pay the interest on and principal of said bonds, as the same shall become due; and that the probable life of such improvement is determined to be a period of forty (40) years; Adopted: Ayes, 5; Nöes, None.


