The Annual Election of Officers for the Village of Angola, N. Y., was held in accordance with General Village Law, at the Village Hall, on Tuesday, March 19, between the hours of 1:00 P. M. and 8:00 P. M. with the following result:

Total number of votes cast: 256.

Total number of votes cast for the office of trustee (2 year term) was 256 of which Arthur Burgstrom received 242; Harry Stocker 9; Blank 5 Total 256.

Total number of votes cast for the office of trustee (2 year term) was 256 of which John Helwig received 230; Harry Stocker 8; Blank 18 Total 256.

Total number of votes cast for the office of Mayor was 256 of which John C. Erick received 242; Geo. Kingan 5; Frank Sweetland 3; Fay Ingersoll 1; Blank 5 Total 256.

Total number of votes cast on Proposition to pay Trustees \$50. each annually was: 138. 95 ballots were cast in favor of proposition; 29 ballots were cast against proposition; 14 ballots were cast blank. Total 138.

Meeting called for purpose of acting on new electric contract and change in water rates.

Meeting called to order at 2:00 P.M. by Mayor Erick.

After a general discussion of the new electric contract the following resolution was regularly made, seconded and carried:

RESOLVED, that the Village of Angola enter into a contract with the Niagara, Lockport & Ontario Power Co. for furnishing the electric power for the Village Pumping Plant as particularly provided in the form of a contract submitted and for a term and rates as therein expressed and it is further

RESOLVED, that said contract in the form submitted be and the same is hereby approved, and the Mayor and the Village Clerk be and they are authorized and directed to execute and deliver the same in the name of the Village.

Resolution offered by Mr. Leone and seconded by Mr. Walters and unanimously carried.

The matter of increasing the water rates in the lower bracket was discussed and it being determined that the sale of water at 7-1/2¢ per 1000 gallons was less than cost of pumping same it was

Moved by Mr. Walters and seconded by Mr. Stocker that the rate for water sold (above the first 8000 gallons in each quarter) be increased from 7-1/2¢ per 1000 gallons to 15¢ per 1000 gallons (in the Village), and from 15¢ per 1000 gallons above the first 8000 gallons, to 20¢ per 1000 gallons (outside the Village), said new rate to be charged on all bills beginning with the 2nd quarter of the present year (1935) and as rendered June 30, 1935; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Leone and seconded by Mr. Baer that Robert P. Galloway be appointed Village Attorney for the ensuing year; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Helwig that the regular meetings of the Board be held on the 1st and 3rd Monday evening of each month; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Baer and seconded by Mr. Leone that a contract be let to Anthony Pfohl, Sr. for the collection of garbage, ashes and all other refuse, for the ensuing year at a price of \$720.00 per year, and that Attorney Galloway prepare contract for the signature of Mr. Pfohl; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Baer and seconded by Mr. Leone that the applications of Samuel Holland and Walter Lehning for the position of Water Supt. be tabled to await action at the next meeting; Carried.

Appointment of Fire Commissioner to fill vacancy caused by

expiration of the term of office of one of the Commissioners be held pending action of the Fire Dept.

Appointment of Trustee for the Angola Library tabled awaiting action of the Library officials.

Moved by Mr. Leone and seconded by Mr. Burgstrom that Irving Librock be appointed as Village Policeman for the ensuing year at a salary of \$900.00; Carried.

The Treasurer and Clerk of the Village having been appointed April 2, 1934, for a term of two (2) years no action was necessary.

Mayor Erick appointed Trustees Baer and Leone as auditing Committee for the ensuing fiscal year.

Mayor Erick appointed as a Budget Committee to prepare the 1935-1936 Village Budget, Trustees Helwig and Burgstrom and Village Clerk Dye. (Village Law, Sec. 111.

Meeting called to finish unfinished work of last meeting.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Erick at 8:00 P. M.

The matter of the failure of the Allis-Chalmers Mfg. Co. to complete the Panel Board to meet Underwriters' requirements was discussed and Mr. Elmendorf of the Lozier Engineering Co. was given authority to compel said Allis-Chalmers to fulfill their contract; in event of their failure to do so within a time to be specified by our Engineer, the work shall be done by a competent electrician and the cost of this work to be deducted from Allis-Chalmers contract. All members of the Board agreed with this arrangement of the matter.

Moved by Mr. Leone and seconded by Mr. Helwig that we retain the present pumpers (Ferris, Crawford and Widner) under new rules and regulations to be supplied by the Board; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Leone that Max Ferris shall be head pumper at a salary of \$100.00 per month; that he shall be subject to call in case of emergency at all times (in addition to his regular trick as pumper), and that he shall have complete supervision of the pumping station and responsible for the proper operation and care thereof; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Leone that the salary of Pumper Crawford and Widner be increased from \$80.00 to \$90.00 per month, dateing from April 1; Carried.

Moved by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Baer that all former contracts between Village Water employees and the Village be and they hereby are cancelled; Carried.

Regularly moved seconded and carried that we re-employ Samuel Holland as Supt. of Water on a month to month basis only. No contract to be issued.

Moved by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Helwig that owing to the work envolved and the time devoted to the position, supplying of office, etc. that the salary of the Village Clerk and Tax Collector (J. H. Dye), be increased from \$500. to \$750. per year, dating from April 1, payable in monthly installments of \$62.50. Carried.

The village approval of the new Fire Dept. Officers and appointment of Fire Commissioner was held over for future action.

The appointment of Library Trustee for the 5 year term not having been presented by the Library officials, the matter was held over for future action.

Mayor Erick appointed as a Water Committee: Arthur Burgstrom and John C. Erick.

Clerk was directed to notify Ferris, Widner and Crawford to be present at next regular Board meeting, Apr. 15.

Clerk presented figures as basis for 1935-1936 Tax Budget to the Budget Committee. Action deferred until nex meeting.



The following agreement was submitted to the Board by the New York State Dept. of Public Works, Highway Dept. for action:

The Village of Angola, State of New York, hereinafter referred to as the Village, and the New York State Department of Public Works, Division of Highways, hereinafter referred to as the Highway Department, hereby agree as follows:

1. That the Highway Department will submit a project for the improvement of 0.32 miles of the Angola-Brant S.H. 642 eliminating the crossings at grade of the tracks of the Nickel Plate and Pennsylvania Railroads, and to be designated as New York W.P.G.M. Project No. 931-A R C 3683, and will recommend its approval by the Secretary of Agriculture for construction with funds apportioned to the State under the Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of 1935 (Pub. Res. No. 11-74th Congress) for constructing highways and related projects in accordance with provisions of the Federal Highway Act; subject, however, to the condition that the Village shall provide for the proper maintenance, after completion of the improvement, of the sidewalks, stairways, marginal roadways and water lines, shown on the plans to be constructed under this project.

2. That the said Village hereby requests the Highway Department to submit

the aforementioned project with the recommendation that it be approved by the Secretary of Agriculture, and agrees that if such project is approved and constructed by the Highway Department and the Secretary of Agriculture, it thereafter, at its own cost and expense, will maintain the sidewalks, stairways, marginal roadways and water lines, to be constructed under this project, in a manner satisfactory to them, or their authorized representatives, and will make ample provision each year for such maintenance."

Moved by Mr. Baer and seconded by Mr. Helwig that the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized to sign Highway Agreement covering maintenance by Village of Angola of sidewalks, stairways, marginal roadways and water lines as shown on plans submitted by New York State Highway Dept. covering project No. 931 - A. R.C. 3683, eliminating grade crossing at grade of the tracks of the Nickel Plate and Pennsylvania Railroads on the Angola-Brant Road.

The Mayor of the Village of Angola, Erie County, New York, is hereby to make, execute and deliver such note or notes or the renewal or renewals thereof, if any, to the Evans National Bank of Angola, and the Clerk of the Village of Angola, be, and he hereby is directed to affix to said note, notes or the renewal or renewals thereof the corporate seal of the Village of Angola, and the said Clerk is hereby directed to attest said note or notes, renewal or renewals thereof, each shall bear on its face that it is issued against uncollected portion of 1935 Village Tax levy due and payable to the Village of Angola.

Regular meeting Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola, N. Y., held Monday evening, January 6th, 1936, at Village Hall.

Meeting called to order at 8 P. M. by Mayor Erick.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Mr. Justin Walters, Geo. Pearsoll and Cecil Brown were present and complained that water was entering their cellers. The matter was discussed and Water Supt. Ferris was instructed to look into the matter.

Mr. Howard Barrett, Atty. for the Evans Town Board presented the new Fire Dist. Contract to the Village Board for signing. The terms of the contract are: Fire protection service to be rendered by the Angola Fire Dept. to the Protective Fire Dist. for a term of three (3) years from Jan. 1, 1936 for the sum of \$1500.00 per year. The contract was turned over to the Fire Dept. for approval before being signed by the Village.

Messrs Drago of the Bison Canning Co., Village Engineer Cotton and Engineer L. M. Saunders, who has charge of the Grade elimination at the Peensylvania And Nickel Plate crossing were present. The Drago's complained of the change in size of service water line as proposed by the State Highway Dept. and it was decided between the State Engineer in charge of the work, Village Engineer Cotton and The officials of the Bison Canning Co. that the following letter be sent to the State Highway Dept. Mr. C. R. Waters, Dist. Engineer, at Buffalo:

"At a meeting of the Village Board of Angola, N. Y., Monday evening, January 6th, 1936, the matter of the changing of water mains due to the building of subway at Nickel Plate RR crossing on the Angola-Brant Road was discussed and the following changes were adopted:

The 8" water mains at approximately 400 ft. from where your project starts are to cross from west to east side of road, so as to serve Nickel Plate RR. and Bison Canning Co. and then connect back into 8" main south of new subway. From this point a 6" main is to berun to serve consumers north to tracks and dead end there. Another 6" main to start (where 8" is crossing road as mentioned above) and run south on west side of road to take care of hotel consumer in new location and then plugged beynd that point."

Mr. Baer stated that water from the street entered the gas filler cap in front of hhs service station, and asked permission to raise the cap slightly, to prevent further trouble. Mr. Burgstrom moved that Mr. Baer
