Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Moved by Mr. Baer and seconded by Mr. Leone that Village purchase one new Burroughs Typewrite, for use by Water Dept. at a cost of \$102.50; that same be paid for in ten (10) equal monthly payments of \$10.25 each, beginning March 1, 1936. Carried.

A letter from the Newcomb-Long Post regarding the curbing of fast driving in the village, the placing of boulevard signs, etc., was received. Action on same to be taken at a future meeting.


X Back water bill against Ivan Clark was discussed and inasmuch as bills rendered to him for the 5 quarters in 1931-32 seem out of reason due to the fact that his bills before and after that period were much smaller, it was moved by Mr. Baer and seconded by Mr. Helwig that we accept ~~as~~ settlement the average charge per quarter as previously and subsequently billed. Carried.

X Back water bill against Theodore Miller discussed and it was moved by Mr. Leone and seconded by Mr. Helwig that Water Supt. notify Mr. Miller that at least one-half of said bill must be paid on or before February 1st, and balance within 30 days thereafter or service would be discontinued. Carried.

A letter was received from the Angola Fire Dept. stating that the Dept. would not sign the new contract between the Village of Angola and the Town of Evans until the Village had pledged itself in writing that it would buy a new fire truck within one year. Inasmuch as the Village has in the past met all requests of the Fire Dept. for supplies requested, and considering the general arbitrary tone of the letter, the Board deferred action until a later meeting.

Village Clerk Dye reported that arrangements had been made with the M. and T. Trust Co. of Buffalo whereby said bank would take up bonds and interest coupons, now due, and hold same as collateral in lieu of loan, thus releasing funds now held in reserve for general village purposes. The amount of such bonds and interest coupons taken up by the M. & T. Trust Co. to be a direct obligation of the Village to the said M. & T. Trust Co.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Erick.

Object of meeting: To act on Bond Issue.

Mr. Helwig, Trustee, offered the following resolution and moved  
its adoption:

WHEARAS, this Board of Trustees, on the 18th day of June, 1934, duly  
adopted a resolution, subject to a permissive referendum, determining to  
enlarge the capacity of the present water system and to improve the quality  
and to increase the supply of the water now being furnished to consumers and,  
among other things, to cause to be constructed a new intake and a new filter  
plant, and to add certain new equipment to the present pumping equipment,  
and to erect a new steel stand-pipe with a capacity of three hundred thousand  
gallons, together with the necessary pipe lines, basins, mixing tanks, filter  
units, and other necessary appurtenances and appliances, wholly at the ex-  
pense of this Village, and appropriating the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars  
(\$60,000.00) therefor, and determine to raise such amount or as much thereof  
as necessary by the issuance of the bonds of this Village, and determining  
the probable life of such improvement to be forty years, and

WHEREAS, notice of the adoption of such a resolution was duly posted  
and published and no proposition of protest was filed against said resolu-  
tion requesting that it be submitted to the electors of the Village for their  
approval or disapproval, and

WHEREAS, such resolution became effective on the 18th day of July,  
1934, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of this Village did thereafter issue and sell  
the Coupon Water bonds of this Village in the amount of Sixty Thousand  
Dollars (\$60,000.00), dated August 1st, 1934, and bearing interest at the  
rate of five and twenty-five hundredths per centum (5.25) per annum, and

WHEREAS, the appropriation heretofore made of the sum of Sixty Thousand  
Dollars (\$60,000.00) is insufficient for the purposes thereof, and ~~the~~ ad-  
ditional funds are required for the completion of the improvement heretofore  
authorized,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board of Trustees does hereby  
determine, subject to a permissive referendum, to complete the improvement

hereinbefore referred to, in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore approved and to perform certain additional work in relation thereto, and furnish certain additional equipment including pump, piping, fittings, and electrical work, and additional filter complete, pressure guage and line from stand-pipe to plant, check valve and pit, wholly at the expense of this Village, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for the purposes aforesaid this Board of Trustees does hereby appropriate a sum not to exceed Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00 and determine to raise such amount or as much thereof as shall be necessary by the issuance of the bonds of this Village, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board of Trustees does hereby determine the probable life of such improvement to be forty years, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Village Clerk shall, within ten days after the adoption of this resolution, post and publish a notice in the Angola Record, the official newspaper of the Village, substantially as follows:

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION  
SUBJECT TO A PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN pursuant to Article 5-A of the Village Law that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola on the 15th day of January, 1936, adopted a resolution, subject to a permissive referendum, determining to complete the work of enlarging the capacity of the present water system and improving the quality and increasing the supply of water now being furnished to consumers, in accordance with plans and specifications heretofore approved and to perform certain additional work in relation thereto and furnish additional equipment including pump, piping, fittings, and electrical work, and additional filter complete, pressure guage and line from stand-pipe to plant, check valve and pit, the probable life of which is estimated to be forty years, wholly at the expense of this Village, and for such purpose to expend the sum of not exceeding Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00), and to issue bonds of the Village of Angola for such amount or so much thereof as may be necessary,

south Main street was brought up, and it was moved by Mr. Burgstrom and  
seconded by Mr. Helwig that the claim, amounting to \$10.00, be allowed  
and an order drawn in favor of Mr. Conrad for the amount.

Carried.

The letter from the Newcomb-Long Post American Legion, read at the  
Jan. 20th meeting, and at that time, filed for further consideration,  
was again read. The request of the Post that some action be taken to  
curb speeding on our streets, and the erection of Boulevard Stop Signs  
was considered. The Clerk was directed to inform the Post that it would  
co-operate in every way within its power; that the matter of speeding  
would be called to the attention of Town Constable Elmer White.

The offer of Louis Rosen of Jamestown, N. Y. to purchase the old  
pumps, motors, engines and other junk material at the old Pumping Plant  
was considered, but no definite action was taken as the price offered  
was considered to small.

Action on the request of the Angola Fire Dept. for a new Fire Truck  
to replace the old Chevrolet Chemical Truck, having been held over from  
our last meeting, was again taken up and the Clerk was directed to in-  
vite the Executive Committee of the Fire Dept. to meet with the Board  
at its next regular meeting, to be held Feb. 17th.

Meeting called to order at 8 P. M. by Mayor Erick.

In the absence of Trustee M. D. Baer, the Mayor appointed Trustee Arthur Burgstrom to act as auditor at this meeting.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Several members of the Executive Committee of the Angola Fire Dept. were present and the matter of the Department's request for new fire truck was discussed. Fire Chief Frawley was instructed by the Board to obtain prices and terms of purchase on a truck such as would meet the requirements of the Dept. (to replace old Chevrolet Chemical truck) and report to the Village Board at a later date. X

The matter of calling a Caucus for nomination of two trustees in place of M. D. Baer and Frank Leone, whose terms of office expire April 1st. was gone over and it was decided to hold a caucus at a place to be determined later, and to hold same Wednesday evening Feb. 26. Clerk to prepare such notice for publication in the official paper. Also to prepare petition to legalize action at such caucus inasmuch as the law requires that party caucuses be held. Notice was prepared by Clerk but withdrawn by Village Attorney Galloway, who stated that such a caucus would not be legal. A petition was circulated placing M. D. Baer and Frank Leone in nomination to succeed themselves. Same was duly circulated and signed by 25 qualified voters, and filed with the Village Clerk Feb. 24, 1936, at 2 o'clock P. M.

The matter of back and current (1935) Village taxes against property assessed to Henry Clark was brought to the attention of the Board by the Village Clerk who stated that Frank White, who holds mortgage on the Clark property, had stated that he would pay all back and the current tax if the Board would waive the penalty and interest charges on the back taxes. Matter was discussed and it was moved by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Helwig, that the proposal of Mr. White be accepted. Later Mr. White informed the Clerk that Mr. Clark had paid the mortgage and that the Village would have to look to Clark for payment of the taxes.

WHEREAS, for the better furnishing of water for domestic use and fire protection in said water district during such improvement project to avoid interruption of existing service, and to enable the Angola Waterworks to better collect its accounts for water heretofore and now being supplied to consumers within such district, it is desirous to continue the present method of sale and distribution of water within such district by the Village of Angola during the construction of the extensions and improvements therein mentioned; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Angola Waterworks of the Village of Angola be authorized and empowered to continue the sale and distribution of water within the boundaries of Water District No. 2, Town of Evans, in the same manner as in the past and now in effect, to and including December 31, 1936, and during such period to charge and collect from the consumers therein water rents for the use of water consumed to and including such date; be it further

RESOLVED, that on and after January 1st, 1937, the sale of water and the operation of the water supply system within said Water District No. 2, Town of Evans, be taken over by the Town Board on behalf of said Water District, and that from and after such date the District shall purchase water for use within the District from the Village of Angola at wholesale for 25 cents per thousand gallons, for year 1937, measured by master meter to be installed in accordance with plans and specifications as a part of the construction project hereinbefore mentioned.

Minutes of last regular meeting read and approved.

In the absence of Village Clerk Dye, due to illness, Jos. Kinkead was appointed to act as Clerk at the meeting.

Mr. W. J. Condon of the Conden Safe Co. was present and after due discussion it was moved by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Helwig that we purchase one Model No. 182 Class A Four-hour steel safe for Village Clerk's Office, at a cost of \$135.00. Carried.
