Regular meeting Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola, N. Y., held Monday evening, Jan. 3rd at Village Hall.

Meeting called to order at 8 P. M. by Mayor White.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Trustees M. D. Baer and Frank Leone, auditing committee, being absent, Mayor White appointed Trustees Clow and Helwig to act on bills at this meeting.

Village Clerk presented a statement of village finances and stated that it would be necessary to borrow funds to meet bonds and interest due and run Village to end of fiscal year, Feb. 28th, 1938. Two notes, one for \$1000.00 and one for \$900.00 authorized June 7th, 1937, for payment of Fire apparatus (not borrowed, as funds were on hand from 1937 taxes to pay for same) was re-authorized, and also a tax note (for balance of uncollected 1937 taxes amounting to \$3,486.08) as follows:

Trustee John Helwig, offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Resolved, that Fire Apparatus loan (from Evans National Bank) authorized June 7, 1937, for the sum of \$1,900.00 be and the same hereby is re-authorized, under terms and conditions contained in resolution made June 7th, 1937. Seconded by Mr. Clow and Carried.

Trustee Jesse Clow, offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Resolved, that the Mayor and the Clerk of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola, N. Y., be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to borrow, in the name of the Village of Angola, from the Evans National Bank of Angola, a sum not to exceed \$3,400.00 and to execute a promissory note or notes in a sum not to exceed \$3,400.00 in anticipation of the collection of unpaid village taxes for the year 1937, and that said unpaid taxes be and they hereby are assigned to the Evans National Bank of Angola; that as said taxes are collected they are to be deposited in a special "Assigned Tax Fund" and subject to the order of the said Evans National Bank; and be it further

Resolved, that the Mayor of the Village of Angola, N. Y., is hereby to make, execute and deliver such note or notes, or the renewal or renewals thereof, if any, to the Evans National Bank of Angola, and the Clerk of the Village of Angola, N. Y., be, and he hereby is ordered and directed to affix to said note or notes, renewal or renewals thereof, the corporate seal of the Village, and the said Clerk is hereby directed to attest said note or notes, renewal or renewals thereof; each shall bear upon its face that it is issued against uncollected portion of the 1937 tax levy, due and payable to the Village of Angola, N. Y.

Seconded by Trustee John Helwig and carried unanimously.

Reg. Mtg. Jan. 3rd, 1938, continued.

Application having been made to the State Highway Dept. for permit to lay sewer pipe on South Main St., Trustee Clow offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Resolved, that the Village of Angola shall assume full responsibility for any damage or liability which may occur due to the repair, replacement or construction of the sewer proposed in application.
