Meeting called to order at 8 P. M. by Mayor White.

Minutes of last regular meeting read and approved.

Clerk presented statement of finances showing necessity of borrowing approximately \$4000. on unpaid 1938 taxes and asked authority to transfer from Back Tax fund to General fund the sum of \$1300.

Moved by Mr. Clow and seconded by Mr. Helwig that Clerk draw check on Back Tax fund payable to General Fund the sum of \$1300.00.

A petition from Pennsylvania Railroad Co. objecting to Franchise Tax assessment (fixed by State) for the tax year 1939 was received and filed. Petition dated Dec. 13, 1938.

In the absence of Trustee Frank Leone (auditor) Mayor White appointed Trustee Jesse Clow to act on bills at this meeting.

Trustee Jesse Clow offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, that the Mayor and the Clerk of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola, N. Y., be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to borrow, in the name of the Village of Angola, from the Evans National Bank of Angola, a sum not to exceed \$4000.00 and to execute a promissory note or notes in a sum not to exceed \$4000.00 in anticipation of the collection of unpaid village taxes for the year 1938, and that said unpaid taxes be and they hereby are assigned to the Evans National Bank of Angola; that as said taxes are collected they are to be deposited in a "Special Assigned Tax Fund" and subject to the order of the said Evans National Bank; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Mayor of the Village of Angola, N. Y., is hereby to make, execute and deliver such note or notes, or the renewal or renewals thereof, if any, to said Evans National Bank of Angola, and the Clerk of the Village of Angola, N.Y., be, and hereby is ordered and directed to affix to said note or notes, renewal or renewals thereof, the corporate seal of the Village, and the said Cler is hereby directed to attest said note or notes, renewal or renewals thereof; each shall bear upon its face that it is issued against uncollected portion of the 1938 tax levy, due and payable to the Village of Angola, N. Y.





RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola does ordain, enact, prescribe and establish the following rules and ordinance with penalties for the violation thereof:

SECTION 8A--Stop Streets. Every driver of a bicycle, motorcycle, automobile, motor truck or other motor vehicle shall bring his vehicle to a full stop, unless otherwise directed by a police officer or signal, before entering or crossing any of the following named streets, which are hereby designated as main arteries of traffic: Main Street between the northerly and southerly limits of the village: Lake Street between High Street and the westerly limits of the village: High Street at Center: Mill Street at Orchard.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a penalty of not less than \$ 5.00 not more than \$ 100.00 for each violation thereof, and in addition thereto, such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

This ordinance shall take effect on the 30th day of November 1939, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk be instructed to enter the foregoing ordinance in his minutes and cause the same to be published and posted in accordance with provisions of Section 95 of the Village law.
