Meeting called to order at 8 P.M. by Acting Mayor Baer.

Minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Helwig and unanimously carried.

WHEREAS, from the accounts of unpaid taxes heretofore returned by the clerk of the Village of Angola, N.Y. to this board for the years 1933 thru 1941, both inclusive, the following taxes still remain due and unpaid after due notice and demand on each of the property owners for the payment of said taxes, to wit:

COPY OF LIST ON FILE, Village Clerk's Office.

And WHEREAS no action has been commenced to recover said unpaid taxes and no sale on account of said unpaid taxes has heretofore been held pursuant to law.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that such unpaid taxes shall be collected by the sale of taxes as provided in Section 126-D of said law: that a copy of this resolution, certified by the Clerk, shall be transmitted forewith to the Treasurer of the Village, with the account, affidavit and certificate of such unpaid taxes, and that the Village Treasurer, upon receiving such account of unpaid taxes and a certified copy of this resolution be and she hereby is authorized and directed to cause to be published in the official newspaper of the village, once each week for three successive weeks, a list or statement of the real estate upon which such taxes are unpaid, as shown in the tax list, with the amount of the tax, fees, interest and charges thereon and also notice that the said real estate will, on a day subsequent to the expiration of said three weeks to be determined by said Village Treasurer and specified in said notice, to be sold at public auction at a place in said Village to be designated by said Village Treasurer, to discharge the tax, fees, interest and charges aforesaid, which may be due thereon at the time of such sale, and the said Village Treasurer, at the time and place specified in said notice, proceed with the sale of said real estate upon which such taxes are unpaid, as above set forth, and continue the same from day to day until sale is completed. Further Be it Resolved, that in all cases where no bid shall be made on a lot or parcel of land so offered for sale for an amount sufficient to pay the said tax, fees, interest and charges, the said premises shall be deemed to have been sold to and purchased by the said Village of Angola, N.Y.




