Minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

Motion made by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Carbeck that we engage Mr. Sam Catalano of the Evans Builders Supply to plow the village streets for the balance of this winter season at \$ 5.00 per hour. Catalano to furnish truck, crew and equipment necessary for this operation, and also to supply village with copy of adequate insurance coverage. Carried.

Mr. Carl Barrett of the Barrett Insurance Agency appeared at meeting and explained that he had checked into our Public Liability insurance and this policy made no provisions for property damage.

Motion made by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Helwig that we add property damage in the amount of \$ 1,000-5,000 to our present Public Liability Insurance and step up our Public Liability from 10,000-50,000 to 25,000-50,000 and cover our new tractor for property damage, liability, fire and theft insurance. 

Kinkead as Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to prepare or to have prepared, upon the form prescribed by the Supt. of Public Works of the State of New York, a statement to be signed and verified by him claiming such payment, which statement shall include only expenditures for snow control on public ways within the boundaries of Erie County during the periods mentioned in subdivisions (1) and (2) of Section 2 of such chapter for the following items exclusively: (1) Labor costs exclusive of the salaries or wages of persons regularly employed for municipal purposes, but payments for overtime work on snow control by such regularly employed persons may be included; (2) rental of hired equipment other than new equipment rented from manufacturers or dealers; (3) motor fuel and lubricating oils and greases; (4) cost of erecting and dismantling snow fences; and (5) sand and chloride.

Regular Meeting, Board of Trustees, Village of Angola, N.Y., held at Village Hall, Monday Evening, December 17, 1945.

Meeting called to order at 8 P.M. by Mayor Lorenz.

Minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

Due to absence of Trustee Iannello of the Auditing Committee, Mayor Lorenz appointed Trustee Carbeck to act as Auditor at this Meeting. Trustee Iannello appeared later in meeting.

Motion made by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Carbeck that the board favor having Section 43 of the Village Law amended to provide for an indefinite term instead of two year appointment and placing position of Village Clerk in competitive classification of civil service. Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded by Mr. Carbeck that Water Plant Operator Leo Widmer, lately returned from military service, be granted a leave of absence to May 6, 1945. Carried.

The following resolution was made by Mr. Iannello and seconded by Mr. Burgstrom and carried:

WHEREAS; The Board of Trustees at it regular meeting held on the 21st day of May 1945 expressed its judgment that it would be for the best interests of the Village of Angola to authorize and permit the use of Angola Fire Department equipment and the fire company when called outside the Village, and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees at said meeting directed that a public hearing should be held on the 4th day of June 1945 for the purpose of hearing all those interested who are in favor of permitting and authorizing the continued use of said Fire Department outside the Village of Angola, and all those who are opposed thereto, and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of such public hearing was duly provided by law, and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees has now held such public hearing and has heard all those in favor of continuing the permission to use Angola Fire Department men and equipment on fire calls outside the Village of Angola, and there being none who appeared in opposition thereto, and said Village Board has determined, after due deliberation thereon, that it is for the best interests of the Village of Angola that such an ordinance be adopted, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ANGOLA:

"The Chief of of the Angola Fire Department is hereby authorized and permitted to send the Fire Department, Emergency Relief Squad, Fire Police Squad or Fire Patrols to the aid of another city, Village, Town, Fire District, Fire Protection District, Fire Alarm District or territory outside the Village of Angola, except where specifically directed otherwise by the Village Board." Effective Date Jan. 2, 1946.

The Village Clerk is hereby instructed to publish same in the official newspaper of the village once and a printed copy thereof posted conspicuously in at least three public places in the village for at least 10 days before same shall take effect.

Chief R.O.Frawley and Earle Holtz of the Angola Fire Department appeared at meeting and asked that action be started to build a Village Hall and Fire Department Headquarters. After considerable discussion with the Board it was decided to hold a meeting of a committee from the Fire Department with the Village Board on Thursday January 10,1946 and to invite a representative of the firm of Bley & Lyman, Architects from Buffalo;






