Rev. Worden Updyke, Rev. Glenn Coykendall, Thomas Drago, John Beeman and Sigurd Groh appeared at meeting and presented a petition signed by 50 tax-payers of the Village of Angola asking the Village Board to purchase the property of Mrs. William Schack, at foot of Lasalle Street, for a baseball and recreation field.

After a lengthy discussion a motion was made by Mr. Iannello and seconded by Mr. Carbeck that a referendum be held on Village Election day, March 16, 1948, to purchase property for a recreation field at a cost not to exceed \$ 2,000.00 and that a committee from the various local organizations be selected to recommend a proper location. A roll call of members of the board was taken and this motion was unanimously carried.

Motion made by Mr. Burgstrom and seconded Mr. Carbeck that the plans for a new Firehall, Municipal Building and library as submitted by Duane Lyman & Associates, Architects, Buffalo, N.Y. be accepted. Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Iannello and seconded by Mr. Carbeck that a referendum be held on Village Election day, March 16, 1948, for permission to float a bond issue not to exceed \$ 120,000.00 to finance the erection of a Firehall, Municipal Building and library on the site of our present Village Park. Carried.
