The Village Clerk presented a statement of water department finances and stated it would be necessary to borrow funds to operate this department until our next collection time in April.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Carbeck and seconded by Mr. Burgstrom and unanimously carried.

REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTE RESOLUTION OF MARCH 7, 1949 OF THE VILLAGE OF ANGOLA, COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$ 2,000.00

Be it resolved this 7th day of March 1949 by the Village Board of the Village of Angola, Erie County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. That, pursuant to the Local Finance Law of the State of New York, said Village of Angola in anticipation of the collection of a specific revenue other than real estate taxes or assessments, to wit, water rent collection to become due and payable during the fiscal year commencing March 1, 1949 shall issue and sell a revenue anticipation note in the amount of \$ 2,000.00 to mature on April 20, 1949.

Section 2. That the amount of the uncollected specific revenue aforesaid, to wit, water rent collection against which the said note is authorized to be issued is as of the date hereof the sum of \$ 4,500.00 and that there are no other outstanding revenue anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the receipt of such revenue.

Section 3. That, except as herein specifically prescribed, said note shall be of the date, terms, form, contents and place of payment and at a rate of interest not exceeding five per centum per annum, as may be determined by the Treasurer consistent, however, with the provisions of the said Local Finance Law of the State of New York, and shall be executed in the name of the said Village by its Treasurer, and the seal of the Village shall be attached thereto.

Section 4. That said note shall be sold at private sale by the Treasurer at a price of not less than par value and accrued interest, if any; and upon the due execution and sale of said note, the same shall be delivered to the purchaser upon the payment by him to the Treasurer of the purchase price in cash, and the receipt of such Treasurer shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 5. The full faith and credit of the Village of Angola, Erie County, New York, are pledged to the punctual payment of principal and interest on said note.

Section 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

Mr. William Miller appeared at meeting and presented a survey sketch of a proposed street off Woodard Avenue that he wished to dedicate to the village, and he was informed that same must be presented to the Board of Trustees in writing in compliance with Village Law-Section 144.

The Board of Fire Commissioners of the Angola Fire Department appeared at meeting and requested the following material for the Fire Department. 2 Leather Portable Lamp Straps, 3 Scott Air Packs, 6 Chimney Bombs, 1 Fire Aid Kit for Truck # 2, 1 Indian Fire Pump (Copper) Type # 90, New Inner Tubes as required for Trucks 2 & 4, Extend external 4" Pipes on Water Heaters, 24 Gaskets, Rubber, for 1 1/2" Hose. They also asked for permission to use the room formerly occupied by the Library.

Motion made by Mr. Frawley, seconded by Mr. Sibley that the Fire Commissioners be given permission to purchase the above material as required to the extent of money available in budget for this purpose. Unanimously Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Sibley and seconded by Mr. Frawley that the Angola Vol. Fire Co., be given permission to use that portion of room formerly occupied by Library that lines up directly to east wall of building with the present quarters of the Fire Department. The other portion of room will be reserved for the Village for storage purposes and the expense of partitioning off this portion with a door near east wall will be defrayed by the Village. All costs of repairs to room made available to the Fire Department will be at the expense of the Angola Vol. Fire Co. Unanimously Carried.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Carbeck, seconded by Mr. Frawley and unanimously carried:

For the preservation of the safety, health and comfort and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of Angola pursuant to the powers vested by law in the Board of Trustees of said Village, be it

Resolved, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola does ordain, enact, prescribe and establish the following rules and ordinances with penalties for the violation thereof:

Section 9a: Parking Time Limited in Designated Areas: No person shall park a vehicle longer than two (2) hours at any time between the hours of 8 A.M. and 5 P.M. of any day except Sundays and Public Holidays, within the district or upon any of the streets described in Schedule I attached to and made a part of this ordinance.

Schedule I.

Parking limited to two (2) hours between the hours of 8 A.M. and 5 P.M. of any day except Sunday and Public Holidays within the district or upon any of the streets as follows: (1) On both sides of Main Street from its intersection with School Street to the tracks of the New York Central Railroad. (Route 323, SH 990)

(2) On both sides of Commercial Street from Main to High Street. (Village St.)

(3) On both sides of Lake Street from Main to High Street. (co. Rd. # 5)

Section 9 (b)

PARKING ON ONE SIDE OF STREET ONLY:

When signs are erected in each block giving notice thereof no person shall park a vehicle on such side of the street ~~as shall be prohibited upon the street or portion thereof~~ as shall by signs be prohibited upon the street or portion thereof described in schuld. II attached to and made a part of this ordinance.

Schedule II

- (1) Parking is prohibited on the east side of Park Alley. (Village St.)
- (2) Parking is prohibited on the north side of School Street between Main Street and High Street. (Village St.)
- (3) Parking is prohibited on ~~the north side of~~ Center Street from High Street to New York Central tracks. (Village St.)
- (4) Parking is prohibited on the north side of Lake Street from the Catholic Church Alley to Lorain Street. (Co. Rd. # 5)
- (5) Parking is prohibited on the north side of Lake Street from Glenwood to a point two hundred feet west thereof. (Co. Rd. # 5)
- (6) Parking is prohibited on Washington Street on the west side from Lake Street to ~~Green~~ ^{Commercial} Street. (Village St.)
- (7) Parking is prohibited on High Street on the east side from Lake Street to Commercial Street. (Village St.)
- (8) Parking is prohibited on High Street on the west side from Lake Street to School Street. (Village St.)
- (9) Parking is prohibited on the south side of Mill Street from Main Street to Orchard Avenue. (Co. Rd. # 477)

Section 15

ONE WAY STREETS

Upon these streets and parts of streets described in schedule III attached hereto and made a part hereof, vehicular traffic shall move only in the indicated direction when signs indicating the direction of travel are erected and maintained at every intersection where movement in the opposite direction is prohibited.

Schedule III

- (1) Park Alley: Traffic shall move only in a southerly direction. (Village St.)

Section 12: Penalty

Section 12 of the Angola Village Ordinances is amended so that section shall read as follows: Any person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of the Angola Village ordinances where there is no other specific penalty provided shall be deemed guilty of disorderly conduct and may be punished by a fine not exceeding ten (\$10.00) dollars for the first offense and for a second or subsequent offense by a fine not exceeding one hundred (\$100.00) dollars; in addition thereto a violation shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person and such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct and such person shall be a disorderly person.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with the terms of these ordinances and amendments are hereby repealed; provided however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency, and in all other respects these ordinances and amendments shall be cumulative of other ordinances and amendments governing and regulating subject matter covered by these amendments. These amendments shall be in full force and effect and after their passage, publication, posting and approval as required by law. *EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 1, 1949.*

Motion made by Mr. Carbeck and seconded by Mr. Sibley that village clerk be given authority to make the proper moves relative to publication, posting and adoption of these ordinances, and that these ordinances shall be in full effect thirty days after publication and posting of same. Unanimously Carried.

Mr. Donald M. Neff, Personnel Officer of the County of Erie, who was invited to this meeting relative to the status of the police positions in the Village of Angola, notified the Mayor that due to illness he would be unable to attend this meeting, but would be at our next meeting.

The following resolution was presented by the Town Board of Evans to the Village Board of Angola.

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, that a regular meeting of the Evans Town Board, held at Evans Town Hall, Angola, N.Y., on Wednesday, October 5, 1949, at which meeting all members were present, the following resolution was duly adopted.

RESOLVED: that in consideration of the continuance of the now existing rates by the Village of Angola during the year 1950 for the use of water in Water District No. 2, that a contract be entered into with the Village of Angola covering hydrant rentals on lines owned by the village of Angola within the Angola Protective Fire District, outside of any existing water district, at a rental of \$ 1,000. for the year 1950, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the fire protection contract now existing between the Town of Evans and the Village of Angola be amended, if necessary, to conform with the provisions of this resolution; and be it further

RESOLVED, that such payment be made to the Village of Angola, for the use and benefit of the Angola Waterworks, on or before March 1, 1950, and be a charge against said Angola Protective Fire District, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution become effective upon the adoption of a resolution by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Angola accepting the terms hereof, and rescinding the resolution adopted by said Village Board on September 19, 1949 relating to an increase of water rates in said Water District No. 2.

Unanimously Carried.

Mr. Pratt, Sanitary Engineer from Springville, N.Y., appeared at meeting and stated that he had made a preliminary survey of sanitary sewer conditions for the Village of Angola and estimated that cost of same would approximately \$ 248,150.00.
